**Municipal Aggregation**

**WHEREAS**, state law requires a scant 12 percent of basic service electric power to come from nonpolluting renewable sources, with the percentage increasing by 1 percent annually; and

**WHEREAS**, other municipalities in the state are using municipal aggregation to increase the percentage of renewable power provided to their residents and businesses by between 5 percent and 25 percent in excess of the percentage required in state law; and

**WHEREAS**, the cost of electricity in those communities is at worst slightly higher and in some cases slightly lower than the cost of basic service electric power; and

**WHEREAS**, the cost of electricity in those communities is at worst slightly higher and in some cases slightly lower than the cost of basic service electric power; and

**THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED** that the Quincy City Council authorizes the Mayor and appropriate department(s) to research and develop a plan to participate in a contract, or contracts, to aggregate the electricity load of the residents and businesses in the City of Quincy so as to increase the percentage of Class I renewable power in residents' electricity, as per MGL 164, Section 134, independently or in joint action with other municipalities; and further authorizes the Mayor to execute all documents necessary to accomplish the same.
