### **Summer Enrichment Fair Pro Tips**

#### **What to Think About Before the Fair**

1. What type of learning experience would you like to have (academic, travel, internship, etc.)?
2. What is your preferred location (i.e. a college campus, community based program, or abroad)?
3. How far are you willing to travel for your summer experience?
4. Are you looking for a free program or are you able to support yourself financially to participate? How much can your family contribute? Does the program offer scholarships to cover costs?
5. You may not have time to stop by every information table. Select your top organizations and see them first.

#### **Important Questions to Ask During the Fair**

1. What are the requirements for participating in your program?
2. Is the program free or are there costs associated with participation?
3. Does the program provide scholarships? If so, is there a separate application process?
4. If I am interested in applying to your program, how should I follow up? What is your contact information?

#### **Following Up After the Fair**

1. Email the programs/representatives you are most interested in. Thank them for speaking with you at the fair and ask any follow up questions you might have. Tip: don't wait too long to send this email; send an email within 7 days of the event.
2. Pay careful attention to the application timeline and be sure to meet ALL deadlines. Some programs have mandatory orientations and multiple deadlines. These deadlines are final and not flexible.
3. Allow yourself enough time to have an adult to read over your completed application, including your short answers, resume or essay questions. Tip: don't ever send your first draft, always have a second person proofread your answers.
4. Don't put all of your eggs in one basket! Apply to at least THREE programs. You want to have options!
5. Make copies of all the documents that are sent and keep records in case files are misplaced or lost.
