

## Conference on the Future of Europe – Digital Transformation Cluster Input

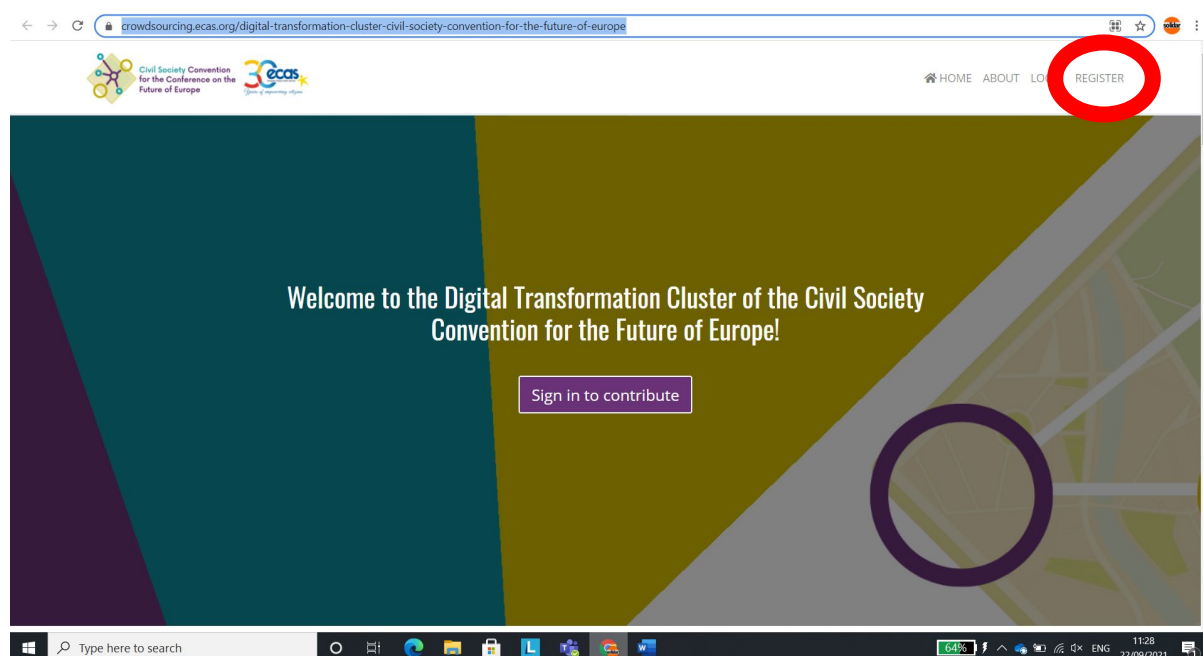
### How to submit your contribution via CrowdSourcing

#### Introduction

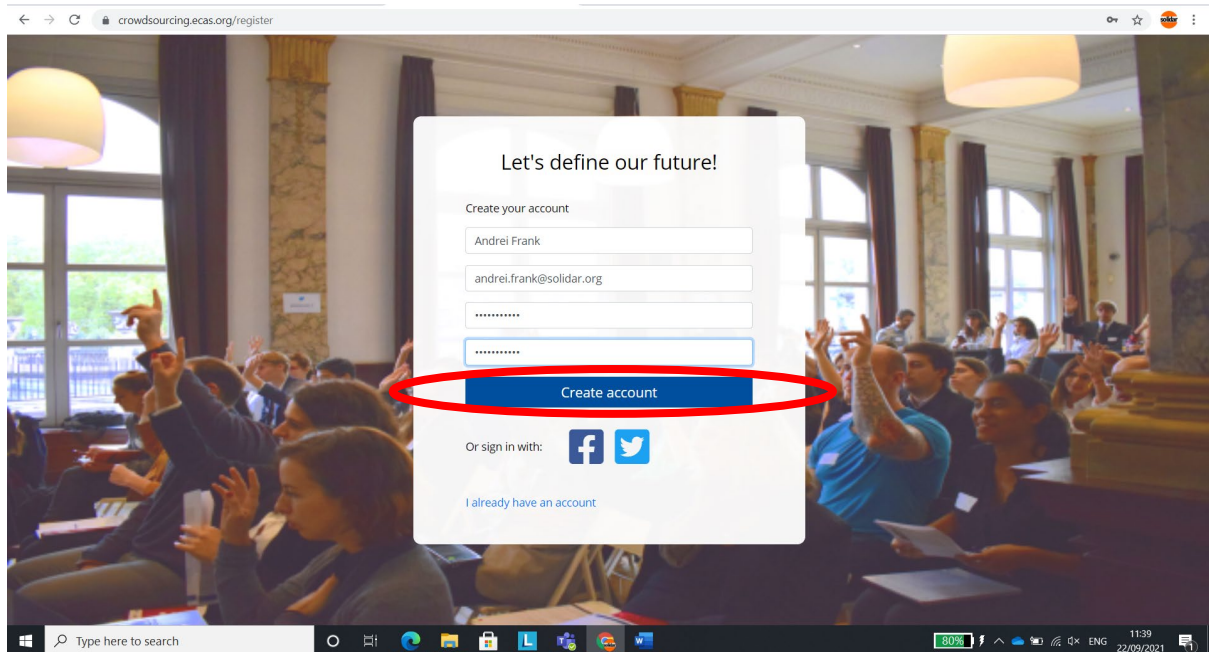
The views of your organization regarding the Digital Transformation aspects of the Conference on the Future of Europe will be collected via a CrowdSourcing platform. The platform contains 5 very short questions, each based on a different topic: (1) Digital Democracy, (2) Digital Education, (3) Digital Safeguards, (4) Defending rights and freedoms online and (5) Digital Economy. Organisations that take part are asked to indicate their policy ideas / proposals in the form of statements (max 2 sentences) under each of the topics that are relevant to them.

#### How-to guide

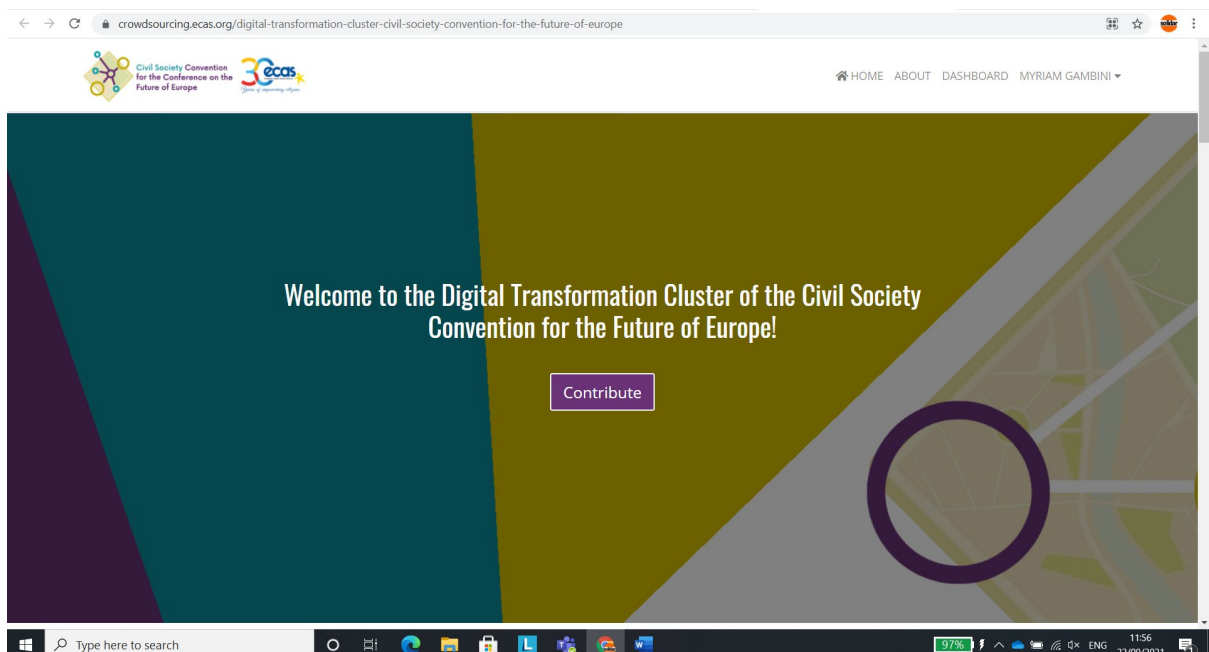
- The platform is accessible here: <https://crowdsourcing.ecas.org/digital-transformation-cluster-civil-society-convention-for-the-future-of-europe>
- Click on the 'Register' button



- On the new page, input your preferred details and then click on the 'Create account' button



- You will receive an e-mail to confirm your registration
- Upon registration, you will be redirected to the CrowdSourcing platform, with the survey that you need to fill in popping up immediately on the screen
- In case the questionnaire does not automatically appear for you, simply re-enter on this link <https://crowdsourcing.ecas.org/digital-transformation-cluster-civil-society-convention-for-the-future-of-europe> and click on the 'Contribute' button as seen below. This should make the questionnaire appear.
