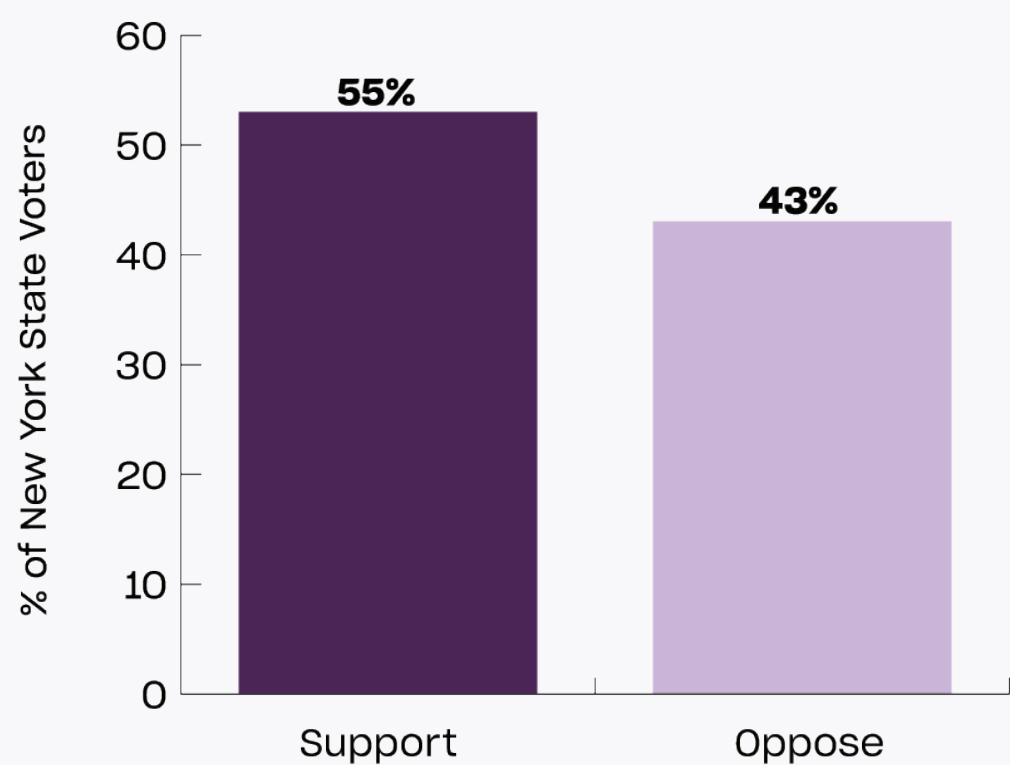


# Stimulus Checks for All

## NYIC/Change Research Poll of NY Voters

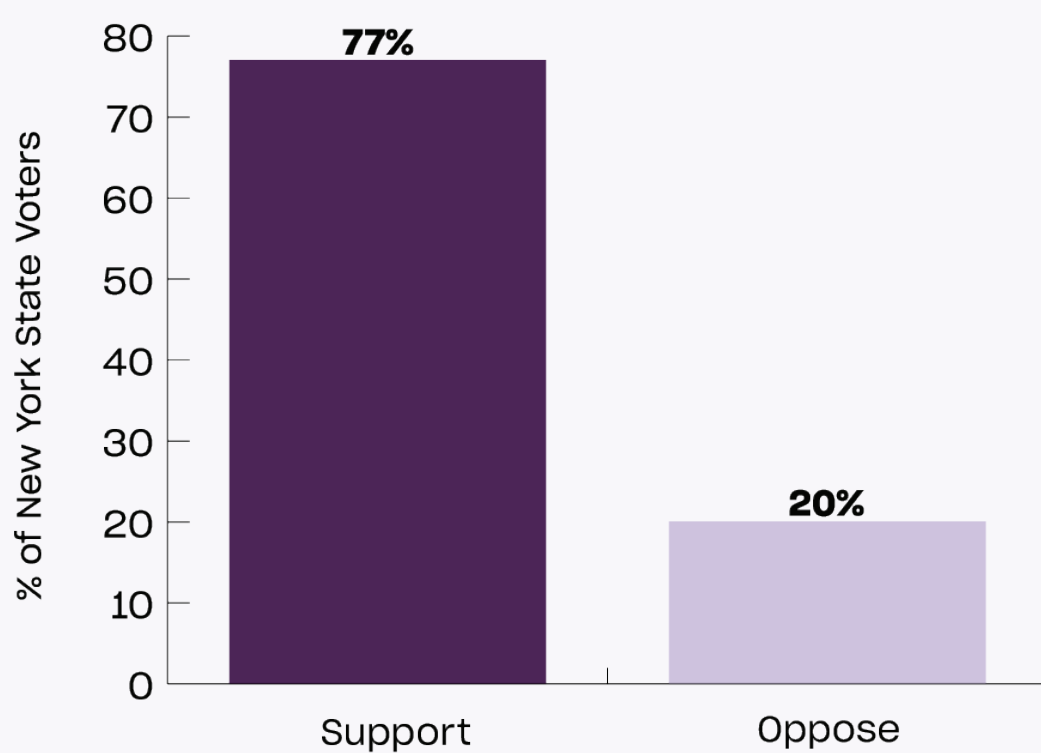
Support for COVID-19 relief payments going to undocumented immigrants who currently pay federal taxes using a tax payer identification number:



**55%** of New Yorkers think undocumented immigrants should receive a COVID-19 relief payment



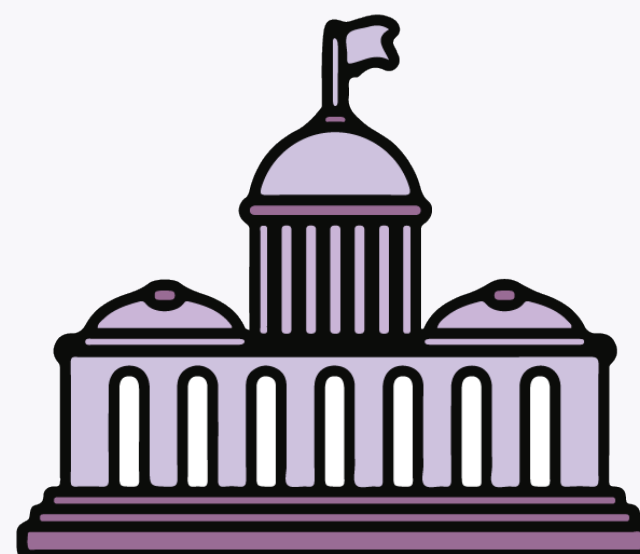
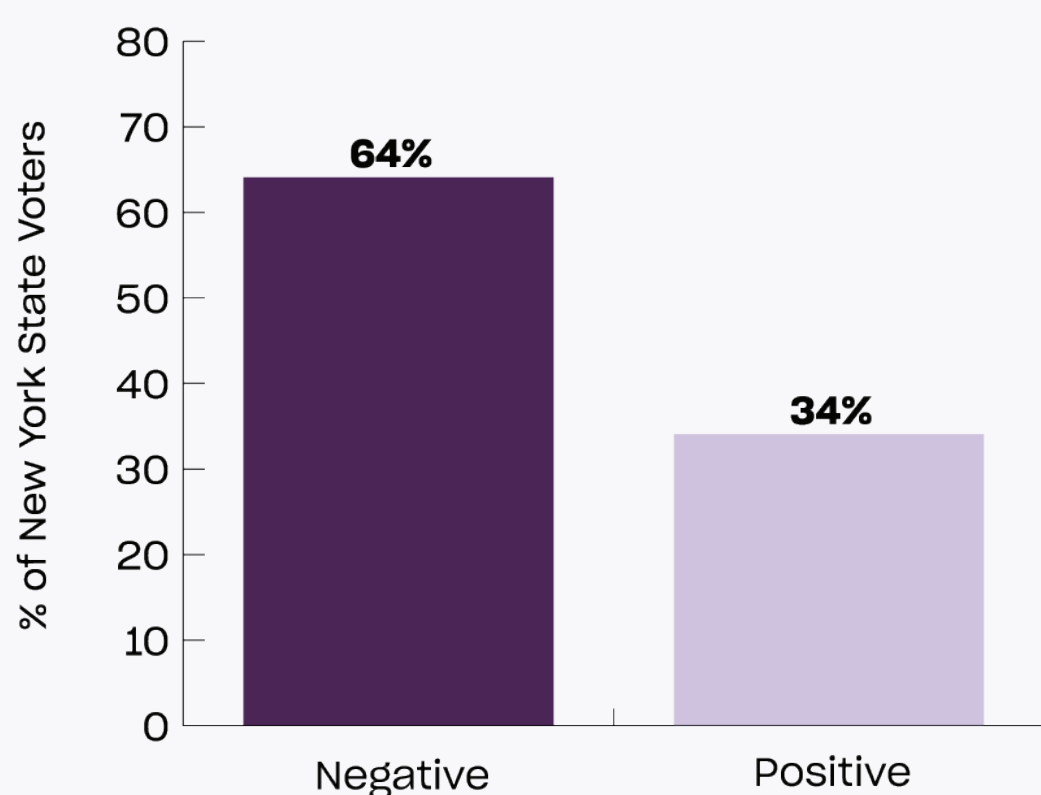
Support for Congress sending another COVID-19 relief payment of \$1,200 for individuals making less than \$99,000 a year:



**77%** of New Yorkers support a second COVID-19 relief payment to families who make less than \$99,000



How New Yorkers rate the job Congress has done in getting COVID-19 relief to American people and small businesses:



**64%** of New Yorkers think Congress hasn't done enough to help get money to Americans and small businesses through COVID-19



## Key Findings:

- 55% of New York voters support providing a COVID-19 relief payment to undocumented immigrants who currently pay federal taxes using a taxpayer identification number.
- 77% of New York voters support providing an additional COVID-19 stimulus payment to individuals who make less than \$99,000 a year this summer.
- 64% of New York voters believe Congress has done a poor job passing bills during the pandemic that get money out to the American people who need the help and to small businesses.

The majority of New York voters support providing a COVID-19 relief payment, like the one distributed as a result of the passage of the CARES Act, to undocumented immigrants who pay to federal taxes using a tax payer identification numbers rather than a Social Security number. Of the 55% of voters who support distributing pandemic relief payments to undocumented immigrants, over one-third expressed “strong support” and one fifth of voters expressed moderate support.

Over three-fourths of New York voters support Congress passing a bill to send a second COVID-19 relief payment of \$1,200 to individuals that make less than \$99,000 and an additional \$500 per child for parents. Over half, 55%, of voters strongly support sending a second relief payment this summer, and 22% of voters somewhat support Congress sending an additional relief payment.

Nearly two-thirds of New York voters have expressed dissatisfaction with Congress’s performance in getting economic relief to individuals and small businesses that need support to weather the impacts of COVID-19. When asked how they would rate Congress’s job in passing bills that provide money to American people and businesses during the pandemic, 35% of voters responded that Congress has done a “not so good” job and 29% responded that Congress has done a “poor” job.
