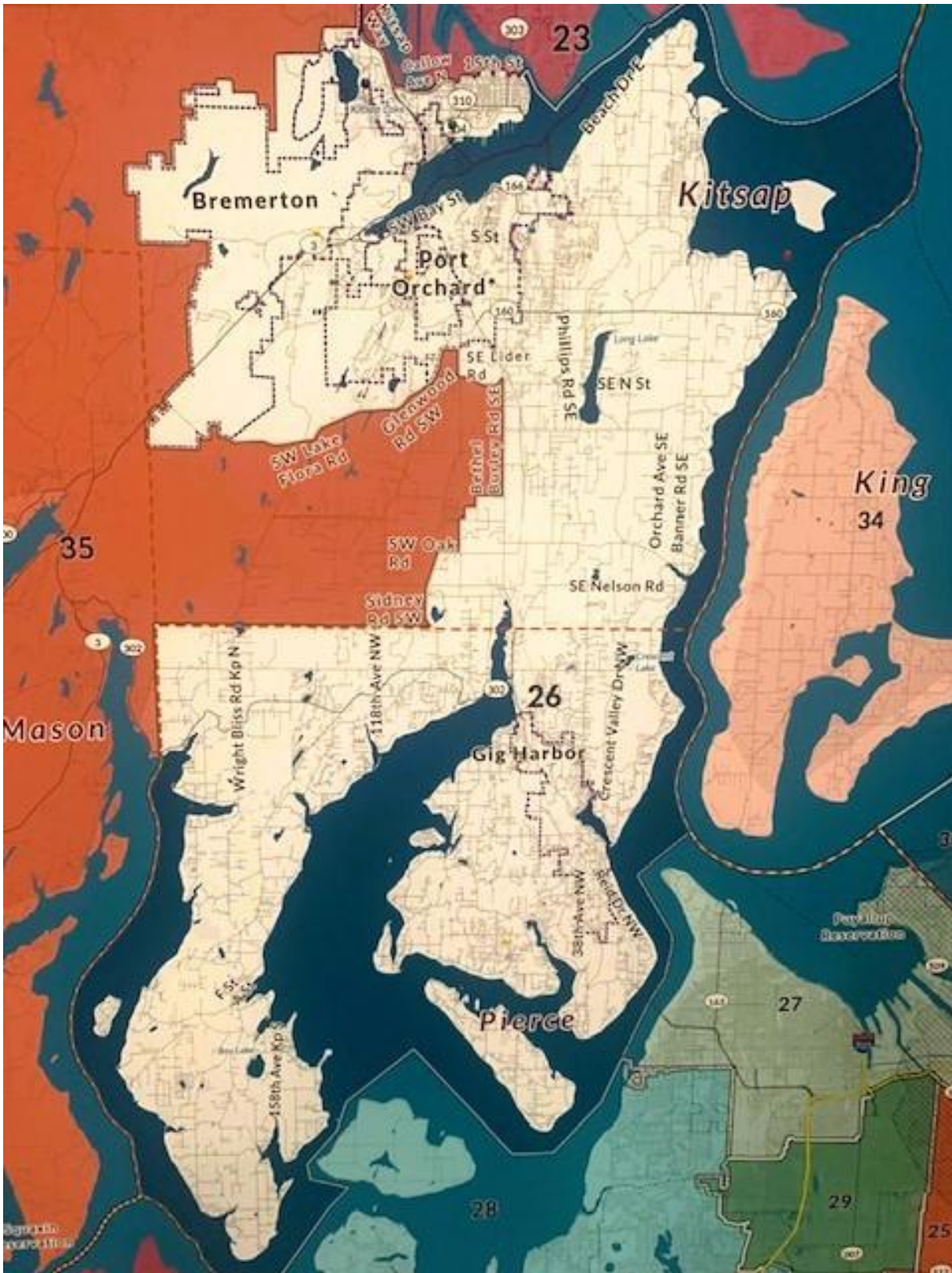

Precinct Committee Officer / Leader

The Backbone of our Organization!

Elected PCO: On state ballot primaries every even year. Must file to run for position. Must live in precinct. Can vote on all issues to include filling partisan vacancies (such as a Sheriff's vacancy), 26th LD resolutions, etc. Only newly elected PCOs may vote on Executive board members at biennial reorganization meeting. May run for executive board positions.

Appointed PCO: Volunteers can be appointed outside of the elections process to open precincts. Must be signed off by LD chair then by respective County chair. Terms end before the reorganization meeting therefore cannot vote for Executive board members at biennial reorganization meeting. May run for Executive board positions.

In residence: They live in the precinct they are appointed to.

Non-resident: They are appointed to a precinct they do not live in.

NOTE: Kitsap Co refers to appointed non-resident PCOs as Precinct Leaders and not Precinct Committee Officers so as not to conflict with RCW (Revised Code of Washington) terminology.

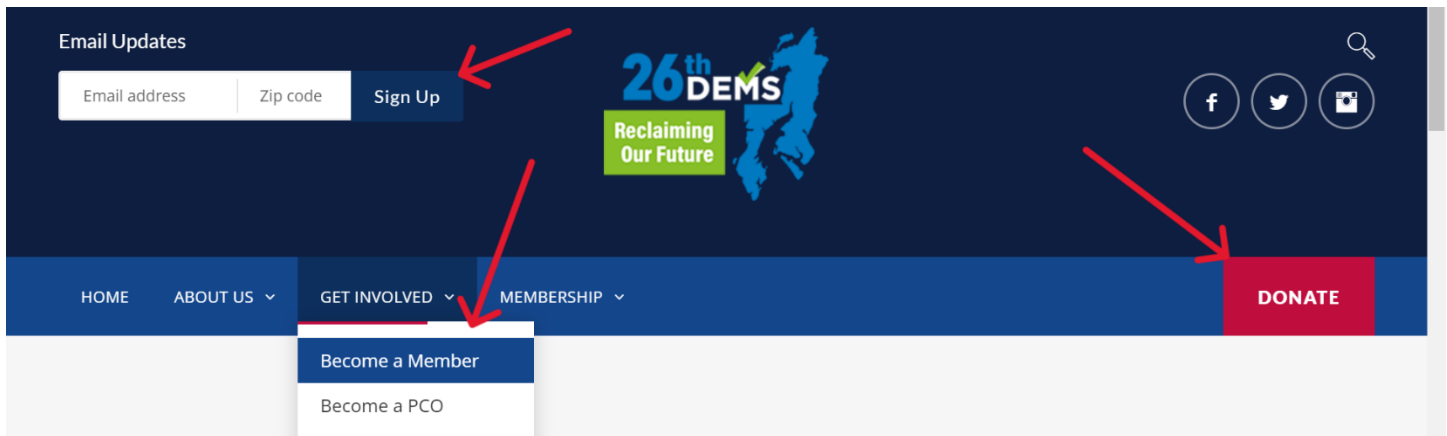

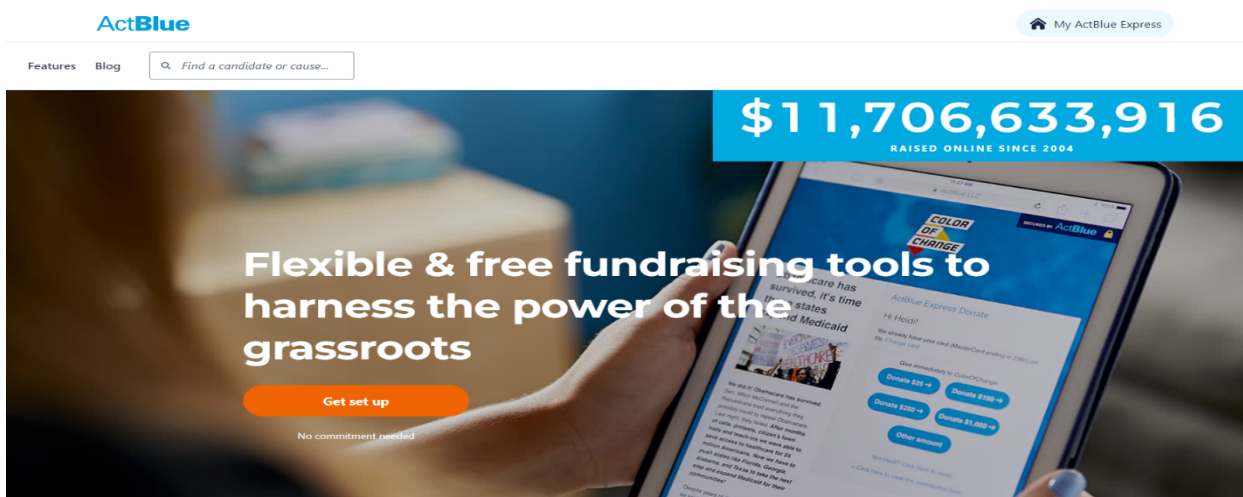
