



If you were watching the conversation at CPAC this weekend, you noticed that one issue area came up more than most: Election integrity. In fact, when polled, 62% of CPAC attendees said election integrity was the most pressing political issue facing our country today--higher than any other issue. It mirrors what we're seeing in national polls. On January 10, just 52% of Americans said they had faith in our elections.

We are witnessing a crisis of confidence in our country's most important and sacred institution: The democratic process. A crisis of this magnitude demands our nation's leaders do something about it.

Below, you'll find two approaches to this crisis. Democrats choose to exacerbate people's fears by crafting legislation that would further undermine faith in federal elections, while conservatives are working to implement common sense rules that can gain bipartisan support and underscore the principle of 1 person, 1 vote.
